The entry-level Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) program at the Department of Occupational Therapy of Nova Southeastern University, Tampa successfully completed its third and final step toward initial accreditation. A team of reviewers performed the rigorous onsite visit and interviewed all faculty, administration, staff, representatives from the Classes of 2015 & 2016, the department's professional advisory council, and fieldwork educators on March 10—12, 2014. Other key people who participated during the onsite process represented several representatives from the university and college administration to Tampa regional campus operations and technology support personnel.



The vision for the program came to fruition as an innovative entry-level doctoral program in occupational therapy that applies the hybrid, or blended model of delivery, accepting its inaugural class of 2015 during the Summer 2012 term. Cutting edge technology has optimized teaching and learning experiences, virtual and real time exchange and interactive environments while creating many types of presences and nurturing opportunities. As the department combines traditional, contemporary and emerging approaches to occupational therapy interventions, it stays faithful to the core values and ethical standards of the profession and the university.
