- Check Driving Directions to Arrive on Campus for Orientation May 11-12 (8:00am)
 - o 3400 Gulf to Bay Blvd, Clearwater FL 33759 (park in rear parking garage).
 - o Dress is professional (bring sweater) as it gets cold.
 - o Bring your laptop computer OR tablet.
 - o Bring cash to purchase NSU lab clothes or NSU swag (optional).
 - o Bring proof of health insurance if not purchasing NSU health insurance.
 - o Significant others are welcome: 8am-12 noon, and again for 5 pm Social Hour on Monday 5/11.
- Send all outstanding transcripts or GRE scores to NSU's Enrollment Processing Service (EPS) as soon as possible. Enrollment Processing Services NSU, PO Box 29000 Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33329
- Join the American Physical Therapy Association as a Student DPT Member (apta.org). This is a requirement for all students. It will ask you to select a state membership, it is the state where you reside.
