Required Computer and Technological Equipment for OTD Students

Q: What technological tutorials should I review <u>prior</u> to attending orientation?

A: To be able to successfully participate in our Canvas training session during orientation, you are required to review the following information:

Q: What type of technological equipment will I need to work effectively in the blended OTD computing environment?

A: To participate in a hybrid/blended OTD course, you are required to have:

- A <u>laptop computer</u> that meets the <u>minimum specifications</u> according to the Hardware Guidelines for Computing at NSU (link: <u>https://www.nova.edu/publications/it-standards</u>)
- The latest version of Microsoft Office (including Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, etc.)
 - o If you have a Macintosh laptop you must have *Office for Mac* software in order to submit assignments in Microsoft format
 - Tip: As a student, you have access to Microsoft products (*Microsoft Office 365 University*) for free
- High Speed Internet Connection
- <u>Photo Capability</u> camera device with the ability to produce still photos and a photo file; acceptable file formats are jpeg (Note: many cell phones are capable of this and are acceptable as long as the photo quality is adequate.)

- <u>Video Capability</u> video camera device with ability to record video and produce a video file; acceptable file formats are wmv, mp4, and mov (Note: many photo cameras and cell phones have this capability. Either is acceptable, as long as the video quality is adequate.)
 - o <u>Webcam</u> for the purposes of Web-based communication with classmates or faculty members (Note: many laptops come with integrated Webcams, which are acceptable)
- <u>Audio Capability</u> A quality external microphone is required. This can be a headset or microphone-only model. (Note: many laptops come with integrated microphones; these often offer <u>inadeguate</u> sound quality)
- <u>Scanning Capability</u> scanning device with ability to scan signed documents into an Adobe Portable Document Format (PDF). (Note: many smart phones are capable of scanning once a scanning app has been downloaded).
- Note: before your class begins, check with the instructor (or advisor, if applicable) of your hybrid/blended course to be certain you have all the technological equipment needed for the course.

A: To have your Canvas course messages, assignments, and announcements accessible on your iPhone, iPad, or Android device download the appropriate *iShark Mobile 1.8* app
