## **OTD Department Orientation**

**Date:** Monday, May 12, 2025

Time: 9:00 AM – Approximately 3:00 PM

Attendance is mandatory

Our Department Orientation is designed to help you feel confident and connected as you begin your OTD journey. During the day, we will:

- Review essential policies and procedures
- Answer your questions about fieldwork, capstone projects, and experiences
- Host a student panel to discuss the transition from undergrad to grad school
- Share insights on coursework continuity
- Introduce you to the OTD faculty

**Lunch will be provided**, and you'll have the opportunity to connect with our Student Ambassadors—some of the friendly faces you met during your interview day. They'll be joining you for lunch to answer any additional questions and help ease your transition.

In addition, you should have already heard from your **second-year "buddy"**—a current student who can offer helpful advice from a student perspective.

Once the program begins, the **Student Occupational Therapy Association (SOTA)** will formally welcome you. We've intentionally delayed their introduction until after classes begin to avoid overwhelming you. Orientation will provide a lot of important information, but remember: asking questions is an essential part of the transition to graduate school, and we encourage you to continue doing so. We're here to support you and will do everything we can to help you feel comfortable and confident as you become part of the NSU family.



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### **HPD General Orientation**

In the **afternoon**, you'll attend your first class: **Movement in Occupation**. Please refer to the Orientation Week Schedule for more details.

Please note: You will also attend Movement in Occupation on Friday, May 16, 2025, from 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM to make up for the missed session on Monday.

### **Dress Code**

We follow the HPD dress code, as outlined in the Student Handbook. A separate dress code handout is included with this packet, and further details will be discussed during Orientation. Key points include:

- **Orientation attire:** Business casual. No jeans, flip-flops, sneakers, or sandals. We recommend comfortable flats or shoes for walking.
- **Labs:** Eggplant-colored scrubs are required. These are available through the NSU Bookstore or online—just ensure the color is **eggplant**.
- Off-campus/special events: Khakis or dark pants (no jeans) and OTD polo shirts. Polos are typically sold by the OT student organization.
- Lab jackets with the college and OT logo will be available for order during the program.
