Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

This equipment will be used in anatomy (Year 1) and neuroanatomy (year 2) Labs. Anatomy faculty will be reviewing the use of this equipment. You **MUST** purchase these devices by 5/29/17!

The NSU Bookstore may carry this equipment, but you may also obtain them online. We have listed websites for these products, but you may find them online through various vendors.

- Nitrile gloves (box of 100) – Must be powder-free
 - They are sized small, medium, large or extra-large
 - Nitrile gloves are available at Cosco, many pharmacies, and even Walmart
- Disposable isolation gowns (pkg of 50)
 - Proadvantage is a manufacturer used by the medical sciences department

Equipment for the DPT Classes

Each DPT student must purchase a kit of supplies that will be used throughout the program and throughout their career. In order to facilitate students obtaining the correct supplies and the high quality supplies required by the program we have collaborated with a company that prepares a kit with the needed supplies. The price of the overall kit is extremely reasonable based on the number and quality of the supplies contained in the kit. Visit the website below to view what's included in the equipment kit. Purchase of the supplies separately is not cost effective and is not allowed.

Each student must access the website below and order the kit before the Fall semester of year 1. The kits will be sent directly to the student at the address given during the ordering process.

During the first week of fall semester classes, students will need to demonstrate that they have obtained the kit. The purchase of this equipment kit is required by the Program.

Technology Requirements

You are required to have a **laptop computer** with a built in webcam and system configurations outlined below. These recommendations were taken from the Hardware Guidelines for Computing at NSU document. Tablets and I Pads do not always support the applications used in the professional DPT program, so **you must have a laptop**.

Minimum Configuration Requirements

- The minimum requirements listed here were developed to help with assessing currently owned computers. These are the minimum levels of equipment and software supported. Depending on specific studies and the

duration of studies the equipment may require upgrade during the course of a particular individual's academic program.

- Intel Core i3 processor, or later
- 4 GB RAM
- 120 GB hard disk
- DVD+-RW combo drive

Minimum Hardware Configuration

- A PC running a Microsoft Windows Operating System (Windows 7 or higher) or Mac OS X with the operating system's minimum requirements for processor, memory, and hard drive (See the Microsoft or Apple website for minimum requirements)
- At least 10.0 GB of free hard-drive space (additional space may be needed for multimedia files).
- 1024 x 768 monitor with a 16-bit or greater video card (24-bit preferred)
- DVD-ROM drive or CD-ROM drive
- Sound card with speakers and microphone.

Minimum Software Configuration

- A Microsoft Windows® Operating System (Windows 7 or higher; please note, release candidate versions are not supported) or Mac OS X
- Microsoft Office 2013 or a more recent version of the Microsoft Office software suite or Apple I suite; students also have the option of accessing Microsoft Office web applications through their NSU Office 365 portal
- A current antivirus and antispymware application that is updated regularly
- Internet Explorer 11.0 or a more recent version, or Firefox 44 or a more recent version, Chrome 48 or a more recent version
- Adobe® Reader® 8.0 or a more recent version (free download)
- Adobe® Flash Player 9.0 or a more recent version (free download)

Internet/Email

- DSL basic or faster speed Internet connections from 200 Kbps - 768 Kbps recommended for best access to most applications
- An Internet service provider (ISP), providing a dedicated, reliable 128 Kbps or faster Internet connection is the minimum recommended access speed
- An email address and account will be issued to all students
